Ans: Teeth are of four types: incisors, canines, premolars and molars.

Incisors are used for cutting and biting food.

Canines are sharp and are used for tearing food.

Premolars are broad teeth, next to the canines. Premolars help to crush food and chew it.

Molars are bigger and flatter than the premolars, with a broader upper surface to chew and grind the food well.

#### 2. Describe the structure of a tooth.

Ans: A tooth has a crown and a root .The crown is the part we see, whereas the root is the part inside the gums. The white part on the outside of a tooth is called the enamel. Below the enamel lies the hard dentine. Inside the dentine lies the pulp. It is very soft and full of nerves and blood vessels. The pulp forms the central part of the tooth.




